The School

St. Joseph Catholic High School is a college preparatory, co-educational school. The school system was founded in 1894, and the system expanded to include freshman and sophomore high school classes in 1993. In 1997, St. Joseph Catholic High School graduated its first senior class.

The central campus in Bryan, Texas serves students in grades 9-12 and maintains an enrollment of approximately 120 students with a small teacher/student ratio and a 100% graduation rate.

Mission

St. Joseph Catholic School System provides a Catholic environment for spiritual faith formation and educational excellence.

Admission

St. Joseph Catholic School enrolls qualified students without regard to race, gender, religious affiliation, ethnic or national origin. Students are eligible to attend St. Joseph School unless there is a specific educational or emotional need that cannot be met.

Dual Credit Courses

Dual credit courses are offered in conjunction with Blinn College. Over 75 % of St. Joseph Catholic High School students enroll in at least one dual credit course.

Honors/Advanced Courses

The numerous advancement opportunities offered at St. Joseph include Biology, Chemistry, Physics, English, Pre-Calculus, Calculus, Geometry, Algebra, SAT Prep, Spanish, Latin I, and Latin II.

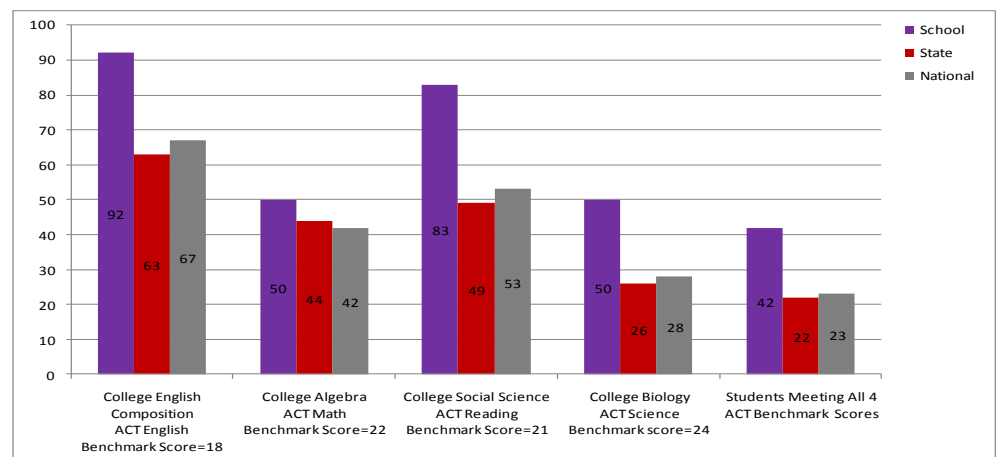
Extracurricular Activities

Percent of Students Ready for College-Level Coursework: ACT Report, Graduating Class 2009



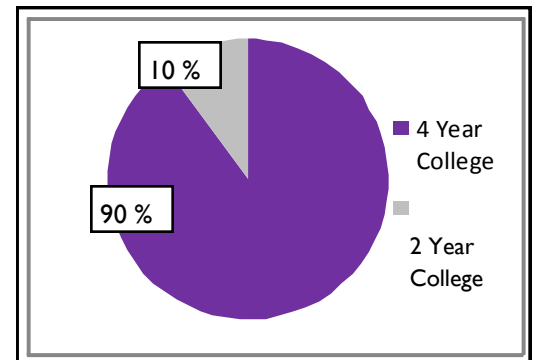

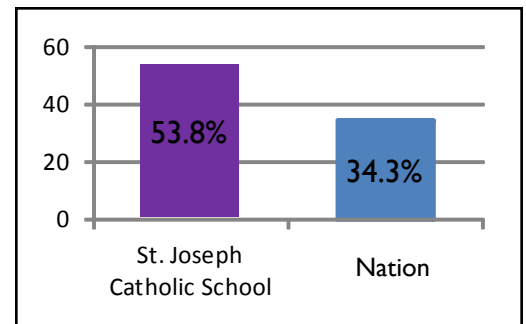

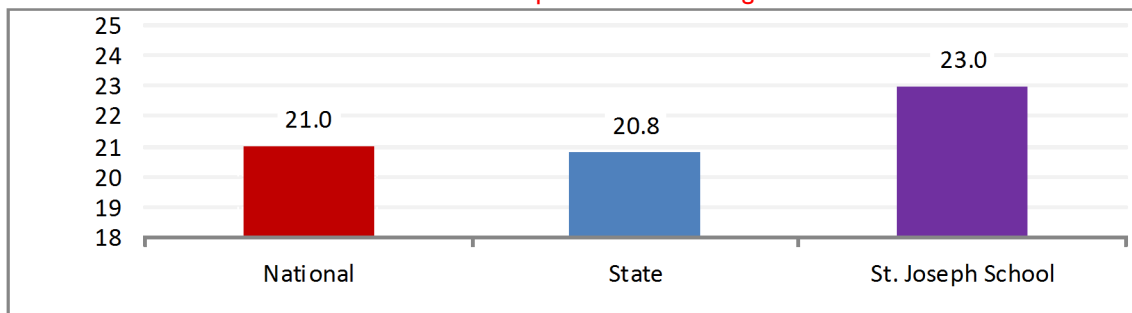
